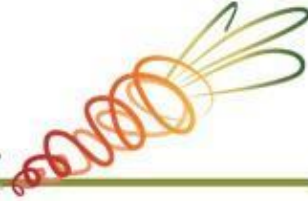

- Completing this self-nomination form shows your interest in serving on the ASNNA Leadership Team (LT).

- Candidates must meet two eligibility criteria (per ASNNA by-laws):
 - 1) Be a SNAP-Ed administrator in a State Agency (SA) or a State Implementing Agency (SIA). Types of positions that meet this requirement include: directors, assistant directors, program coordinators, evaluators, supervisors of field staff, among others.
 - 2) Have at least two years of experience in SNAP-Ed administration.
- LT members must be paid members of ASNNA (through organizational or individual membership).
- The slate of candidates should be representative of different geographic regions, and SIA types (e.g., land-grant university, public health agency, non-profit organization, tribal organization, etc.).
- After you submit the self-nomination form, an LT member will contact you about next steps.
